MRS. FRANK A. AGATHEN

On Thursday night Elizabeth Agathen, wife of Frank A. Agathen, died at the family home in this village after a long illness. Mrs. Agathen was a daughter of Frank and Amelia Kloppenburg, pioneer settlers of Eagle and was born in the town of Palmyra, Dec. 8th, 1856. The family moved to Eagle and resided here to the time of their death. Here Mrs. Agathen attended the common schools, and grew to womanhood. On July 25th, 1885, she was married to Frank A. Agathen, a prosperous young farmer of Eagle and the young couple continued farming until a few years ago when they retired and moved to the village, to enjoy the fruits of their labor. Mrs. Agathen was a woman of domestic tastes, was kind to all and enjoyed the respect and esteem of all who knew her. The funeral took place from St. Theresa church Saturday forenoon. Father Elsinger, pastor, officiating. Interment was in the family lot in the new church cemetery where lies buried the son, Leo, who died May 11, 1915.
