**LOUIS H. CRAWLEY**

News of the death of Louis H. Crawley, which occurred at his home in Milwaukee Thursday April 23d, came as a surprise to his relatives and friends. Mr. Crawley was a son of the late Michael and Rose Crawley, pioneer settlers of Eagle, and was born on the farm now owned by James W. Allpress, on July 6th, 1874. He attended the common schools and when the family moved to Little Prairie he learned the blacksmith trade from P. A. Bealhen. Later he conducted the shop himself. He was married in Palmyra to Miss Emma Hanson of Hartland August 25, 1900. They moved to Spring Valley where he continued his trade and about eight years ago moved to Milwaukee to operate steam engines. Four children were born to them, Earl H., principal of the Eagle state graded school, Pearl and James at home, and Mrs. Albert Heckendorf. The funeral took place from the family home Monday afternoon, Rev. Petheric of Eagle M. E. Church officiating; interment was in the Little Prairie cemetery. He leaves surviving him besides his widow and children two brothers Joseph H. of Little Prairie and Willis of Eagle and one sister, Mrs. George B. Olds of Little Prairie who have the sympathy of all in their bereavement.
