

John Henry Faestel died at his home in Eagle Tuesday noon after a lingering illness, aged 47 years and twenty-six days. Mr. Faestel was born in New York City and was a son of Nicholas and Katherine (Falter) Faestel, who came to Wisconsin from Bavaria, Germany, fifty years ago. He was a carpenter by trade, was married to Josephine Mary, Youngest daughter of Matthias and Elizabeth (Weitzel) Schmid in May, 1884, by whom he had two sons, Matthias and Herbert, aged 13 years and 10 months respectively. Mr. Faestel was a honest, industrious man and by hard labor and economy accumulated enough of this world's goods to leave his widow and sons in comfortable circumstances. He was a charter member of the Eagle Cornet Band of 1885 and is the first of the band boys to succumb to "Father Time." The funeral will take place today, Friday, from St. Theresa's church of which the family are consistent members.

The members of the band, Edmund J. Lins, George Wilton, Ben Breidenbach, Henry Koibl, Anton Kolb, Matthew Clohisy will act as pall bearers. Interment will be in the new church cemetery. He leaves besides his family, an aged mother, five brothers, Joseph W., George H., Nicholas A., Frank W., Henry and five sisters, Mary, Mrs. Fred Dick, Theresa, Anna, and Mrs. Charles B.
