

DEATHS.

Daniel Griffin.

On Sunday, April 15, 1906, occured the death of Daniel Griffin at his home in Big Bend, Wis., after an illness of many months. Mr. Griffin was born in Oswego County, N. Y., April 27, 1842, came to Wisconsin with his parents in 1836, and settled in the town of East Troy. He was married to Martha Jones, who died shortly after their marriage. Was again married Nov. 11, 1848 to Eliza Jones, a sister of his first wife, who died March 22, 1906, aged 77 years, 2 months and 22 days. The early part of their married life was spent in Jonesville. In 1865



the family moved to Jericho, near Eagle, where they resided until about fourteen years ago when they moved to Big Bend. Mr. Griffin was one of the early Sunday school superintendents of the M. E. church at Eagle, and was a devout Christian worker. He was a kind husband, father and neighbor and was held in high esteem by all. In politics he was a Republican, until 1884 when he joined the temperance party. The funeral took place Wednesday forenoon, Rev. John Per ry of Waterford, officiating. Inte. ment was in the cemetery at Big Ben beside his wife, who preceded him in death only a few weeks. Mr. Griffin leaves surviving him one son, Chesley Griffin of Big Bend, and four daughters, Mrs. T. W. West, Mukwonago; Mrs. C. W. Rose, and Mrs. Ed. Vanderwalker, Big Bend; and Mrs. Herman Hull, Hopkins, Mo. We all extend our sympathy to the bereaved family.

Daniel Griffin.

Died, at the home of Charles Rose in Big Bend, at 6 o'clock, p. m., on Easter Sunday, Daniel Griffin, aged 84 years. Mr. Griffin was born in Oswego, N. Y., April 27, 1822. He came to Wisconsin in the spring of 1836 and was married to Martha Jones of Jonesville, near Mukwonago, July 22, 1841. After the death of his first wife he was married to her sister, Eliza C. Jones, on November 11, 1848, and they commenced life together on a farm near East Troy. The death of Mrs. Griffin occurred three weeks ago, after which he sank rapidly and had no desire to recover. Mr. and Mrs. Griffin were members of and earnest workers in the Methodist church, as were all the members of the Jones family. They leave one son and four daughters, Mrs. Wm. West of Jericho; Mrs. Stella Hull of Minneapolis; Mrs. Edw. Vanderwalker of Caldwell; Mrs. Chas. Rose of Big Bend and Chester Griffin of Big Bend. The Rev. Mr. Perry of Waterford preached the funeral sermon at the Big Bend church, at 10 o'clock, Wednesday morning. Mr. Griffin was buried by the side of his beloved wife. For several years Mr. and Mrs. Griffin have received the tenderest care at the homes of their two sons-in-law, Chas. Rose and Edward Vanderwalker.
