Obituary

Mrs. Elizabeth Hill Henderson died in the Milwaukee hospital Saturday, May 3rd, following an operation performed three weeks previously. At first the operation was thought to be successful and she seemed to gain, but later serious symptoms developed which she could not master in her weakened condition. Through all of her illness she showed great courage and made a brave fight for life.

Mrs. Henderson was born in the town of Mukwonago, June 29, 1850. She was the daughter of Christian parents, who were early settlers of said town, and for many years had charge of a Sunday school which was held in the school house, and there she received her early Christian training and education. After acting as teacher in the public schools for several terms—teaching in the Stewart district, Jericho, and other places—she was married May 30, 1872, to George Henderson of the same town and they took up their residence in the neighborhood of Jericho, where they had since resided. To this union two children were born, Mrs. John Wilton of Eagle, and Roy of Mukwonago, who, with the husband, survive. There are also three grandchildren, two brothers and two sisters to mourn her loss.

She was known near and far for her hospitality and kindly feeling to the needy.

The funeral was held from the home Tuesday afternoon, Rev. J. W. Perry conducting them. The Eagle choir sang. Interment at Mukwonago. The floral tributes were many and beautiful, one coming from the I. O. G. T., of which she was long an active member. The sentiment of the community in which she lived could be summed up in the following lines: We shall miss her words so full of cheer,

And her acts of sincere love;
Her friendship we will ever cherish;
Until we too, are called above.
