OBITUARY.

Lucinda Marcle.

On Wednesday morning at her home in the village of Eagle occurred the death of Lucinda Marcle, widow of the late Norman Marcle, who died February 14, 1902. Mrs. Marcle was born in Canada, December 25, 1831. She was married June 11, 1852, Peter Grems officiating. She was of mixed Holland Dutch and English extraction and her maiden name was Reeves. The family lived in Eagle nearly all the time and Mrs. Marcle can justly be termed one of the pioneers. The husband was a carpenter and contractor by trade and enjoyed a lucrative business, leaving at his death a comfortable income. Mrs. Marcle was an outspoken, industrious and neighborly woman and in the early days was called upon at funerals to prepare bodies for burial. She was kind to the poor, honest in her dealings and lived within her means. She leaves an only child, Alzina, wife of Harry Hesse. The funeral will take place from the family home Saturday afternoon at two o'clock. Mrs. Pierce of Brooklyn, Wis., a spiritualistic medium, will preach the funeral sermon. Interment will be in Oak Ridge cemetery beside the remains of her husband. Among the relatives surviving are G. W. Reeves, Oconto, Julius Reeves, Eagle, Frances Buck and Mattie Boyd, Washington, D.
