Eagle Woman Dies in Hospital

Miss Charlotte Parsons was so regular in her attendance at the Eagle Methodist church that when she failed to appear at Sunday's service, her neighbors knew that something must be wrong.

They found the 72-year-old woman in a coma at her home in the village of Eagle. She was taken to the Waukesha Memorial hospital, where she died yesterday.

MISS PARSONS had returned to her home only a few weeks ago. She divided the winter between visits with her nieces, Mrs. Erla Badinger of Eagle and Mrs. Arlene Matterson of Pewaukee. But during the summer she lived alone in her house in the village.

Miss Parsons was one of those people who was always ready to help others. A practical nurse by profession, she formerly worked at the Methodist home in Milwaukee and at Caples sanatorium in Waukesha. She constantly used her skill to help friends and neighbors.

SHE WAS a life-long member of the Eagle Methodist church and years ago hardly a wedding or funeral was held there but Miss Parsons was the soloist. She was the church organist and a choir member for many years, and many Eagle residents were students in her Sunday school class:
