Sarah Peardon.

On the first day of December Mrs. Sarah Peardon died at Whitewater, aged 81 years, and six months. Mrs. Peardon was born in Cornwall, England, June 4, 1824. Her maiden name was Cory. In 1846 she was married to Wm. Colwell and came to America with him, locating in Eagle for a short time. Later they purchased a farm in Farmington, where Mr. Colwell was accidentally killed, while operating a threshing machine. In 1868 she was married to Richard Peardon, of Eagle, with whom she lived until his death in 1887. Since the death of Mr. Peardon she made her home with her children, six of whom survive her, Mrs. Mary Campbell, and Mrs. Stacie Robinson, Whitewater; Mrs. Hattie Dunning, Sioux Falls, S. D.; Edmund Colwell, Woodland, Minn.; Walter Colwell, Clyde, Kans.; Claude Peardon, Springfield, Ill. Five of her children were with her during her last illness. Mrs. Peardon was one of the early settlers of Wisconsin, coming here in Territorial days, she was a member of the M. E. church and enjoyed a large circle of friends. Besides her children she leaves several step-children in and around Eagle, and a brother, Mr. William Cory Sr. The funeral occurred December 4th at Whitewater, and her remains were taken to Farmington for interment.
