

HELEN LONG AMANN

Helen Long Amann was the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. John Long, pioneer settlers who came here from Canton Argau, Switzerland, and located in the town of Troy where she was born in the year A. D. 1851.

Here she attended school and remained with her parents until her marriage to Frederich Amann, also a native of Switerland, on April 13, A. D. 1869.

Father Franz Spath of St. Theresa church officiated and Miss Mary Loibl, now Mrs. Schmidt of Wymore, Nebraska, and Anton Breidenbach, now of Norwalk, Wis., were the witnesses of the marriage.

After their marriage the young couple immediately engaged in farming on lands owned by Mr. Amann, now being a part of the C. L. Shearer farm, formerly owned by Joseph Voght, a brother-in-law of Mr. Amann.

Later they sold this farm to Mr. Voght and purchased the Martin Lins' farm at Eagleville and in A. D. 1881, they purchased the present home where she resided to the time of her death which occurred on Tuesday, September 23, A. D. 1924.

Two sons were born to this union, Julius, who always remained at home and cared for his aged parents, and Joseph, the eldestt child, who married and resides in the village where he follows the trade of a painter at the present time.

Her husband, who was a civil war veteran and who served as corpora, in Company H, First Wisconsin cavalry, preceded her in death five years ago.

Mrs. Amann was of a quiet home-like disposition and enjoyed her home and home life where she was always glad to meet neighbors and friends and extend to them every courtesy.

The funeral took place from the family home Friday afternoon, Rev. W. J. Perry of North Prairie officiating, assisted by Miss Lottie Parsons and T. F. Rhoads of the church choir.

There were many beautiful floral tributes from the family and friends. Interment was in Oak Ridge cemetery.

She leaves surviving her besides her two sons, four grandchildren, Harold, Everett and Luella Amann, of Eagle, and Mrs. Virgil McGill, Palmyra, who have the sympathy of all in their bereavement.
