**Obituary.**

Dr. C. B. Bannister, the subject of this sketch, was one of the pioneers of Waushara county, whose sudden demise occurred on the 10th inst. was in his 78th year. Dr. Bannister was a native of Bennington, Vermont, where he began the study of medicine, emigrating to Wisconsin in the year of 1844, and first settled in the town of Moxwouago, where he taught school for two terms and held the office of county school superintendent. In 1865 he moved with his family to Eagle, giving his whole attention to the practice of medicine with more than ordinary success. He leaves a widow and one son, C. B. Bannister, of Troy Center, with a large circle of friends to mourn the loss of a kind husband and father and a good neighbor. Though for the past four or five years the Doctor's health was not very good he bore it with patience and fortitude that was remarkable for a man of his age. He was universally liked by old and young. Politically he was a staunch democrat all his life, and nothing pleased him more than to best a republican in argument, yet always conservative, for no one ever knew the Doctor to show malice or envy to a living being. In the death of Dr. C. B. Bannister Eagle has lost a good citizen and one that will be hard to replace. May his ashes rest in peace.

His funeral took place from his late residence on Main street, thence to the M. E. church, where the Rev. W. D. Cox delivered an able funeral address. The remains were interred in the family plot at Oak Ridge Cemetery Friday afternoon at 2 o'clock.
