

George William Burton was born in Eagle Nov. 9, 1885, a son of Edward and Ada Sprague Burton. After attending school in East Troy, Wis., he studied law at Marquette College, Milwaukee. Covering a period of eighteen years he was employed as sales manager in the offices of the Buick Motor Co. in both Milwaukee and Chicago. He spent about one year in service during the latter part of the World War.

In 1922 he was married to Mrs. Clara Smith Munashau, who with one son, George, Jr., survives.

Owing to ill health Mr. Burton came to Eagle six years ago where he remained until his death.

Other surviving relatives are his mother, Mrs. B. A. Carver, and two brothers, Harry B. Burton and Edward J. Burton, all residents of Eagle.

The funeral was held from the residence at two o'clock Wednesday afternoon, the Rev. Howard Grindon of Whitewater, Wis., officiating. Further services were conducted at the grave under the auspices of the American Legion of which he was a member. Burial was in St. Theresa Cemetery.
