Jerome Cook.

On November 19, at his home in Palmyra occurred the death of Jerome Cook after a brief illness. Mr. Cook was born in Oneida Co., N. Y., February 7, 1831, and came to Wisconsin with his parents about 45 years ago. Shortly after arriving here he bought the farm now accepted by his son, Frank, consisting of nearly 200 acres of fine farming lands, which he improved and made a pleasant and profitable home. He was married at Palmyra to Marjorie Pierce in 1864, by whom he had three children, two of whom preceded him in death. Mrs. Cook died about eight years ago. About 16 years ago Mr. Cook retired from active business and moved to Palmyra to enjoy the fruit of his labors and spend the declining years in rest and comfort. In politics Mr. Cook was a Republican and in religion a Methodist and was a church trustee at the time of his death. He was liberal in church work and his purse was always open to charity. The funeral was in charge of Rev. Roberson, of the M. E. church, interment at Little Prairie in the family lot beside his wife and children, who had gone before him to eternal rest. Besides his son, Frank, J., he leaves one sister, Mrs. Wm. Trewyn. We all extend our sympathy.
