PIONEER WOMAN DEAD.

**Mrs. A. R. Hinkley, First Woman Settler of
Town of Eagle.**

Mrs. A. R. Hinkley, the first pioneer woman of the town of Eagle, is dead at the age of 83 years. Her maiden name was Mary Daniels and she was born in Plainfield, N. H. She married Mr. Hinkley at Plainfield in 1838 and her wedded life was thus over sixty years in duration. She left a mansion for her husband's 12x12 log cabin on Eagle Prairie, this cabin being the first building in Eagle and being still standing at the present time. Mr. Hinkley was the first settler of the town of Eagle, taking up a claim in Eagle in 1836. Mr. Hinkley survives his wife and there are seven living children—Leonard D., Frank, Mrs. Mathew Pitman, Mrs. Mary Kline, Mrs. A. J. Pardee, Mrs. R. H. Pardee, Mrs. John H. Payne. The funeral will take place Sunday from the M. E. church of which she was a life-long member.
