She married Mr. Hickley at Plaintield in 1838 and her wedded life was thus over sixty years in duration. She left a mansion for hor husband's 12x12 log cabin on Eagle Prairie, this cabio being the first building in Eagle and being still standing at the present time. Mr. Hivkley was the first settler of the town of Eagle, taking up a claim in Eagle io 1836. Mr. Hinkley survives his wife and there are seven living children-Leonard D., Frank, Mrs. Mathew Pitman, Mrs. Kline, Mrs. A. J. Pardeo. Mrs. R. H. Pardee, Mrs. John H. Pavne. The funeral will take place Sunday from the M. E. church of which she was a life-long member.
