

## Mrs. Anton J. Steinhoff Dies in Town of Eagle

Eagle—Mrs. Anton J. Steinhoff, 45, sister of Miss Katherine Lane, a teacher in the Roosevelt school in Janesville, died at 1 a. m. Sunday at her home in Eagle following an operation.

Elizebeth Ann Lane was born in Eagle March 10, 1883, attended school here and was graduated from the Whitewater state teachers' college in 1913. She taught school in Kenosha and at the time of her marriage to Anton Steinhoff 19 years ago was principle of the state graded school in Eagle.

Mrs. Steinhoff was a zealous worker in her church. She was also a member and the first president of the American Legion Auxiliary in Palmyra. She was especially interested in education and was the clerk of the school board in her district the past 10 years.

She is survived by her husband; four children, Mary Ellen, 16, Carol, 14, John, 11, and Katherine, 7; one brother, John Lane, comptroller of Armour and Company, Chicago; three sisters, Katherine Lane, Janesville, Mrs. A. J. Hewes, Culver, Ind., and Mrs. A. D. Shannon, Oconomowoc; and several nieces and nephews. Her parents and a brother, Dr. William B. Lane, and a sister, Grace Lane, preceded her in death.

The funeral will be held at 9 a. m. Wednesday in St. Theresa's Catholic Church, Eagle, the Rev. C. J. Eschweiler officiating. Burial will be in the Eagle Catholic cemetery.
