Eagle Resident Killed In Truck Accident Last Week

Frank Ine, 48, Eagle was fatally injured Friday morning in Kenosha county when the tank truck which he was driving blew a right front tire and left I-94.

Ine was pronounced dead at St. Catherine's hospital, Kenosha.

Kenosha county deputies said they received word of the acci-

dent at 7:05 a.m. Ine was driving the truck, loaded with propane gas, north on I-94 about five miles west of Kenosha.

The truck left the road, rolled down an embankment, crossed the east service road, and halted near a shallow ditch. The trailer rolled over the cab of the vehicle and crushed it.

Deputies said firemen were called to put out a minor fire in the cab, but truck drivers had already quenched the flames with fire extinguishers. The propane gas did not spill, and it was not involved in a fire.

Ine was born Sept. 19, 1918 in Chicago. He served in the army beginning in 1939. He was employed as a truck driver by Herb King, Bristol.

Survivors are his wife Gaile, Eagle; daughters, Linda, Susan, and Janet Ann, at home; parents, Mr. and Mrs. Frank Ine, Phoenix, Ariz.; and a brother, Arthur, Racine.

Services were held at 2 p.m., Monday in the Strouf-Sheffield Funeral home chapel, Racine. Burial was at Graceland cemetery, Racine.
