NORTH PRAIRIE - Hubert Paul Kipp, age 84, of North Prairie, died Sunday February 17 at the Masonic Health Care Center, Dousman. He was born on March 20, 1906, on the family farm at North Prairie, the son of Frank Frederick and Emma Ann (nee Paul) Kipp. He married Hertha Ida Wohlleben on April 4, 1931, at Milwaukee and they made their home on the family farm.

He was a retired dairy farmer and avid Belgian horseman.

He was a member of the North Prairie United Methodist Church, Dousman Masonic Lodge No. 315 F.&A.M., Dousman Chapter No. 257 Order of Eastern Star, Scottish Rite Bodies and 32nd Masonic Degree. He was a past master of the Eagle Masonic Lodge.

He was also a member of the Wisconsin Master Farmers, charter member of the North Prairie Lions Club, member and past treasurer of the Wisconsin Guernsey Breeders Association and a former director of Golden Guernsey Dairy Co-operative.

He was a 4-H leader for many years and a former member of the Waukesha County Junior Fair Board. He had served for 25 years
