In 1942 she went to live at the Dousman Masonic Home and it was there she suffered a stroke from which she never regained consciousness. She died Sunday, October 10th. Funeral services were conducted by the local chapter of the Eastern Star. Rev. Gregory of Waukesha gave the funeral address and Mrs. Clay Waisner and Mrs. Henry Digman sang two beautiful duets.
