**Mrs. Vincent Stubbs Died After an
Illness of One Hour**

On Friday between the hours of ten and eleven o'clock Mrs. Vincent Stubbs died at the family home after an illness of one hour. During the day Mrs. Stubbs carried on the usual daily routine work at the home. In the evening the family visited with callers who came to serenade the newly married son and his bride. All were happy and planning for the morrow. Suddenly Mrs. Stubbs became ill. Dr. Fitzgerald was called and attended her. On his return home he was recalled but when he arrived she had departed this life. Mr. Stubbs was in Vilas county and the family was overcome with grief.

Mrs. Stubbs was a daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Gibson, early settlers of Genesee. Her maiden name was Anna Gibson, and she was born April 5 1861, was married to Vincent Stubbs Nov. 14, 1887. Three sons were born to them, Joseph, who recently was married to Miss Olive Ridgeman; Clarence and Ervin, all at home and all present when the mother died. Mrs. Stubbs was a kind Christian woman and was beloved by family, neighbors and friends. The funeral took place from St. Theresa church Tuesday morning, Rev. J. A. Ritger, pastor, officiating. Interment was in the new church cemetery. Three brothers, William, Joseph and Jacob, and three brothers-in-law—J. R. Jones, George and Orson Stubbs—acted as pall bearers. Besides the above she leaves two sisters, Mrs. John Regan and Mrs. George Picket. We all extend our sympathy to the bereaved family.
