**GRACE ELLEN LANE**

On Tuesday morning Grace Ellen Lane died at the hospital in Rochester, Minnesota, where she went for treatment Tuesday, Nov. 17th. Miss Lane was born in Eagle and was a daughter of the late John and Ellen Crawley Lane. She was educated in the district school and the Whitewater normal and followed teaching, first at Oconomowoc, then in Depere, Florence, and came to teach in the Eagle state graded school in 1918 and continued in that school until the time of her death.

Her father was a veteran of the civil war and died in 1912. Her mother died Oct. 18th, 1920, and her brother William, assistant veterinarian of the state of Illinois, died in 1919. Miss Lane was president of the ladies' altar society and treasurer of the local branch of the third order of St. Francis. About a year ago she was operated on for gall trouble, later when her health began to fail she went to Rochester in the hope of getting relief, but without avail. She spent her whole life in Eagle, where she was highly respected by all. The funeral took place from St. Theresa church, of which the family are members, Friday morning at nine o'clock thirty minutes, (today) Rev. Elsinger, the pastor officiating, with interment in St. Theresa new cemetery where lie buried her parents. She leaves surviving her four sisters; Mrs. Arthur J. Hewes, Culver, Ind.; Miss Katherine a teacher in the Janesville school; Mrs. Aloysius Shannon, Oconomowoc; Mrs. Anton J. Steinhoff of Eagle, and one brother John, assistant secy. and treasurer of Armour company, Chicago; one uncle, Timothy John Crawley of Jackson, Michigan, besides many nieces and nephews who have the sincere sympathy of all in their bereavement.
