Was the Oldest Dancing Teacher in Wisconsin.

Mrs. Sarah Jane Severance, 78 years old, the oldest dancing teacher in the state, died Tuesday morning of heart failure at the home of a son, Coello B. Severance, 399 Fifty-eighth-st.

Collamer G. Severance, her husband, died four years ago. Mrs. Severance leaves two sons and one adopted daughter, Coello B. Severance of the Severance Dancing academy; Dr. Omro E. Severance, and Mrs. C. J. Steele, Hustler, Wis. The funeral will be held at the residence at 399 Fifty-eighth-st, with burial at Eagle, Wis.
