RICHARD LAWRENCE SHERIDAN

On Saturday, March 26th, occurred the death of Richard Lawrence Sheridan at the home of his daughter, Mrs. C. H. Jeffery, at Eagleville mills. Mr. Sheridan was born in Vermont March 19th, 1855, and was the son of _____ and Margaret Sheridan. The family came to Wisconsin locating first near East Troy and then in Mukwonago on the farm now owned by Robt. Onisch. Here he attended school and assisted the family at home until his marriage to Miss Ida Kilts, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. John Kilts, pioneer settlers of Eagle. Mrs. Sheridan died and he was again married to Mrs. Agnes Holmes, of Troy Center, who also preceded him in death. After several years of farming in the town of Mukwonago first on the John H. Guager farm at Jericho and later on the Maurice Buillon farm, both of which he owned at the time, he purchased the Nichols farm in Ottawa, which he still owns. For some time past he made his home with his daughter. Mr. Sheridan was a man of good character and highly respected.

The funeral took place from St. Theresa church Tuesday forenoon, Rev. F. W. Elsinger officiating, with interment in the family lot in the new church cemetery.

He leaves surviving him one daughter, Mrs. C. H. Jeffery, one son, James Sheridan, now in Milwaukee, one sister, Mrs. Mary Sprague, Eagle, one brother James P. Sheridan, Oconomowoc, besides many nieces and nephews and grandchildren. We all extend our sympathy to the bereaved family.
