AGED PIONEER DIES AT NORTH PRAIRIE

Enoch Silvernail Succumbs to Cancer After Illness of Six Months.

WAUKESHA, Wis. June 6.—Enoch Silvernail, 75, an old and well-known resident of the county, died yesterday of cancer at his home at North Prairie. He had been a sufferer from the disease for about six months. The funeral will be held tomorrow afternoon at 2:30 from the Methodist church at North Prairie, with interment at the North Prairie cemetery, the Rev. Thomas James officiating. Deceased was born in Columbia county, N. Y. He came to Wisconsin from his native state when about 25 years of age, and has since resided at North Prairie, where he managed the elevator for over thirty years. He had a large acquaintanceship throughout the county. He leaves a widow, one son, O. H. Silvernail, chief of the engineering department of the Milwaukee road at Chicago, and a daughter, Miss Gertrude, at home. Mrs. Silvernail is a sister of William Dodmead of Waukesha.
