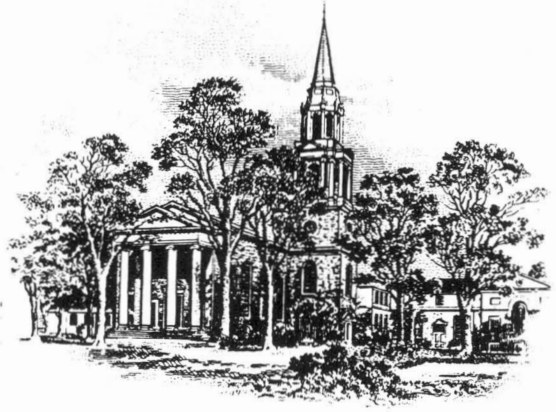


Williams, Richard E.
