

## CATHARINE CLOHISY

On Saturday at Dubuque, Iowa, occurred the death of Catharine Clohisy, aged sixty-seven years. Miss Clohisy was a daughter of Matthew and Bridget Casey Clohisy and was born in the town of East Troy. Her parents were natives of county Clare, Ireland, and came to Montreal, Canada, in 1845. They came to Milwaukee in 1847 and on March 25, 1850, located in the town of East Troy and engaged in farming. The father died March 9, A. D. 1865. The mother continued on the farm until in the early eighties when the family moved to Eagle where the mother died in A. D. 1885. The sons, Daniel and Matthew, conducted a blacksmith shop here for a number of years and the sister, Catharine, took care of the home. Eleven years ago Catharine was taken to a sanatorium in Dubuque where she departed this life. She had many friends here who mourn her death. The funeral was held from the Catholic church in Mukwonago on Tuesday morning, Father Salbreiter, pastor, officiating. Interment was in the family lot in St. Peter's cemetery, East Troy, where lie buried her parents, who preceded her in death many years ago. She leaves surviving her four brothers, John, a prominent druggist in Mukwonago, Daniel of Chicago, Matthew of Milwaukee, both of whom were prominent in business and social life in Eagle for many years, and Arthur, a prominent attorney in Elkhorn, who have the sympathy of all in the loss sustained by the death of the beloved and only sister.
