Ethelyn M. Henderson, daughter of Elizabeth and George Henderson, pioneers of Mukwonago Township was born at Jericho, March 8, 1876.

On July 11, 1900, Ethelyn Henderson and John Wilton were united in marriage and together they managed and later acquired a beautiful farm in Eagle Town.

In 1935, building a house in the village, they came here to reside. Four years later marked a pleasant occasion when their children arranged a celebration honoring their 40th wedding anniversary — to which came many old friends.
