DR. W. B. LANE DIES

AFTER A BRIEF ILLNESS

Dr. William Bernard Lane, 54, a member of the former veterinary partnership of Weese & Lane, died yesterday morning at Aurora hospital, following an operation.

Dr. Lane was born in Eagle, Wis., Jan. 22, 1875. He was graduated from the public schools there and spent his early manhood in that city. At the age of 22 he engaged in business in Chicago. He was married in December, 1903, to Margaret Kipp, of Chicago, and they moved to Oconomowoc, Wis., where they resided for six years, during which time their two daughters, Margaret and Louise, were born. Mr. and Mrs. Lane later moved to Chicago where Mr. Lane attended the Chicago Veterinary college, graduating in 1912.

Shortly afterward he came to Aurora and entered into a partnership with Dr. C. M. Weese. Since the death of Mr. Weese the practice has been conducted by Dr. Lane.

Dr. Lane was known to practically every horseman in this vicinity. The offices of Weese & Lane on Lake street was a rendezvous for local horsemen who gathered to discuss activities of the turf world.

The deceased is survived by his wife and two daughters, Margaret and Louise, both of whom are teaching; one brother, John, of Chicago; ~~also~~ five sisters, Grace and Katherine, of Eagle, Wis.; Mrs. Clara Hewes, of Culver, Ind.; Mrs. Lucy Shannon, of Oconomowoc, Wis., and Mrs. Elizabeth Steinhoff, of Eagle, Wis.—Aurora Ill., Daily Beacon News.
