

Eagle Woman Dies In Traffic Mishap

EAGLE — A 63-year-old widow was killed and her two companions injured in a Dodge County collision Monday.

Mrs. Lillian LeVeille, 602 Main St., was driving the car that collided with a panel truck about 12:30 p.m. at Dodge County Highway P and Highway 33 about five miles south of Theresa.

She was pronounced dead on arrival at St. Joseph Hospital in West Bend.

No one was charged in connection with the accident, according to the Dodge County Police Dept.

Mrs. LaVeille was thrown from her car, police said.

Both her passengers were injured. Phylis Berlick, 66, of Eagle, had a fractured left arm and cuts on the scalp. Agnes Janke, 75, also of Eagle, had a broken right leg and a scalp injury. Both were taken to St. Joseph Hospital.

The driver of the truck, Steven W. Hoehn, 19, of Milwaukee, also was taken to the hospital with head, back and facial injuries.

Mrs. LeVeille had lived in Eagle the past 20 years. Before that, she ran a resort and store on Eagle Lake. She was employed at the Wisconsin Masonic Home, Dousman, as a nurse's aide.

She was a member of the Eagle American Legion Auxiliary and St. Theresa Catholic Church.

Surviving are sons Gerald of Eagle and Roger of Wausaukee; daughter Mrs. Beverly Lowe of

Dundee, Ore.; brothers Norbert Berlick of Neillsville and Harry Berlick of Eagle and sister Mrs. Agnes Janke of Eagle.

Services will be at 10:30 a.m. Thursday at St. Theresa Church. The body will lie in state after 4 p.m. Wednesday at Mealy's Funeral Home, Eagle. Burial will be in Jericho Cemetery. Prayer services will be held at 8 p.m. Wednesday at the funeral home.

The family suggests memorials to St. Joseph Hospital, West Bend.
