GOLD STANDARD THE LAW NOW

President Has Signed the Bill and the National Banks Have Already Begun to Print Their Notes to Pass as National Currency.

Tuesday, March 20. The senate received majority report from the committee on privileges and elections declaring Senator Scott of West Virginia entitled to his seat.

In the house Mr. Sulzer of New York attacked the administration in a speech upon his resolution calling upon the war department for information as to what fortifications Great Britain was erecting on the Canadian border.

Wednesday, March 21. In the senate, Mr. Turner (Wash.) stated he was informed by the governor of Alaska that exclusive concessions for gold mining in the bed of the sea near Cape Nome, Alaska, had been granted by the secretary of war.

In the house, during the debate upon the Loud bill, relating to second-class mail matter, Mr. McPherson (rep., Iowa) charged that Mr. Lentz (dem., Ohio) was the attorney of the lobby which is fighting the bill.

Loud Postal Bill Again Defeated. The house has again declared either that it believes the passage of the Loud bill to amend the law regulating second-class mail matter will not result in the saving \$2,000,000 and upward annually, or that the saving, if made, would be at the expense of the enlightenment and information of the people.

Philadelphia Hospital Fire. More than 150 men, women and children, all ill or hurt, all suffering, some dying, were carried from the Jefferson hospital, Philadelphia Thursday afternoon.

Thursday, March 22. Senator Foraker claims to be certain of enough votes to pass the Puerto Rican tariff bill and will push it to an issue within the next few days.

Friday, March 23. In the senate it was agreed to send the diplomatic and consular bill to conference.

Saturday, March 24. The Puerto Rican tariff bill, appropriating about \$2,000,000, was signed by the president Saturday afternoon. At the same time the Foraker bill was referred for the purpose of separating the house 15 per cent tariff provision from the civil government measure.

Uncle Sam Demands Party Rates. There is little prospect that the railroads will succeed in forcing the government to pay higher rates for the transportation of soldiers than the railroads have been in the habit of making for theatrical troupes, baseball clubs, brass bands and similar aggregations.

Ogla Nethersole Is Indicted. Olga Nethersole was a witness before the grand jury Thursday, but her testimony did not save her from indictment with her leading man and managers.

Receiver for Appleton & Co. Justice Bischoff of the Supreme court Thursday appointed J. Hampden Dougherty receiver for D. Appleton & Co., publisher, on the application of Daniel Prichard, a stockholder. The liabilities are \$1,100,000.

Compromise for the To Repeal Tariff Bill. The president's latest idea is to reach a compromise by reducing the Dingley rates now imposed on Puerto Rican imports to 15 per cent of these rates, as provided by the house bill.

To Establish Cuban Treasury. An order is in preparation establishing a Cuban treasury. This will take large reserve funds from the North American Trust company, which is the fiscal agent of the government.

Trades Unions Denounced. The opening session of the subcommittee of the United States industrial commission in Chicago on Tuesday quickly settled into an inquiry into the local strikes. The testimony of W. J. Chalmers, president of the firm of Fraser & Chalmers, manufacturers, emphatically denounced union federation as the most dangerous of trusts.

Where Cocaine Comes From. Peru produces practically all the raw cocaine that the world consumes. It is manufactured from the leaves of the coca plant, and to supply the demand in the United States the dry leaves are either shipped direct and drug manufactured from them, or a coarse native product made from the leaves in Peru is imported and refined by improved processes.

An Engineering Triumph. One of the latest triumphs in the engineering world consists in the construction, shipment by steamer and subsequent transfer to railway transportation of a steamer of 4,200 tons displacement, which was finally put afloat in Lake Baikal, Siberia, not less than five thousand miles from St. Petersburg.

Waste of Ammunition.

During the Franco-German war the German artillery fired 340,000 shots, and the infantry 20,000,000. This terrible hail of shot and bullets, sufficient to exterminate a nation, resulted in a loss of 45,000 men to the French.

Bled Their Horses. A curious superstition was formerly prevalent regarding St. Stephen's day (December 26) that horses should then, after being first well galloped, be copiously bled to insure them against disease in the following year.

Hannah S. Solomon Chosen. The Council of Jewish Women at Cleveland, Ohio, Thursday, re-elected the old officers. These are: President, Hannah G. Solomon; first vice president, Sophie Beer; second vice president, Babette Mandel; corresponding secretary, Gertrude Berg; treasurer, Bertha A. Selz.

Indians Take to Mineral Water. Mineral waters have come to take a very prominent place in national beverages, especially in the case of those who are suffering more or less from physical derangements.

Deep-sea Oil Well. It is claimed that the deepest oil well in America is situated in the Monongahela river valley, about twenty-five miles from Pittsburgh. The hole has been drilled to a depth of 5,322 feet, but work has been suspended owing to a break in the two and seven-eighths inch rope used.

Railway Carried on a Steamer. A twenty-five-mile railway for the Philippines was recently packed in the hold of a steamer ship at San Francisco. Everything needed for the railroad was sent except the ties, which will be obtained in the islands.
