Subject: Please help! Could someone open the museum on Sunday or Monday?

Hello!

My husband Mike is the nephew of Dorothy and Warren Arndorfer of Eagle, WI. His mother, Helen Arndorfer Kastenholz grew up on Hillcrest Farm and is Warren's younger sister (now both deceased).

Recently I have been doing the genealogy of The Arndorfers.

My husband and I are going to be in the area on Sunday, August 8 and Monday August 9 - for of all things an "Arndorfer Cousins Reunion".

Is there a chance that someone on staff, or a volunteer, could meet us to look at the Historical Society and help a bit with some Eagle research? Specifically I am trying to locate William Hage and Johanna Wynhoff Hage information. See below. I have much information from "Find a Grave" but was looking for locations of residency in or around Eagle when they married and had their children.

I am writing a document to support this family's lineage back to 1789 Grieth, Germany. This is the overview:

The names from antiquity on the maternal side are:

- Jacobina Simons (b: 1789) married Johann (Jean) Apeldorn
 (b 1779). They had three children. Her last name "Simons" is also documented as "Simmes".
 Their eldest daughter who was born in Wissel (or Grieth) Germany is:
- Dorothea Apeldorn (b: 1808) She married Johann Heinrich Wynhoff (b: 1799) in 1830 in or around Till-Moyland, Germany. About 1853/1854 she emigrated to the US with her husband Johann and (I'm guessing based on future research) their children. When they arrived in the US they settled in Racine or Caledonia WI. Their eldest of 10 children, who was born in Till-Moyland, Germany is:
- Johanna Helena Wynhoff (b: 1830). She emigrated to the US (I believe in 1853/1854 with her parents, see above). Johanna would have lived in Racine or Caledonia, WI and she eventually married William Joseph Hage (b: 1849 in England). They married in 1856. The marriage took place about three years after she arrived in the USA. Johanna was 22 years younger than William Hage. William came from England and was an early settler in Eagle, WI. After his death she lived with a Richard Hage. Their eldest of four (4) children who was born in Eagle, WI is:
- Elizabeth Dorothea Hage (b: 1857). She married Joseph William Faestel in 1880 at the age of 23. Elizabeth and Joseph were dairy farmers on Hillcrest Farm, Eagle, WI. Their youngest of four (4) children born in Eagle, WI is:
- Mary Josephine Faestel (b: 1891). She married George Arthur Arndorfer (b: 1886) in 1913 at the age of 22. They continued to farm on Hillcrest Farm. Their four children born there are:
 - Gladys Arndorfer (b: 1915) never married
 - Isabel Arndorfer (b: 1917) married William McCarthy

- o Warren Arndorfer (b: 1920) married Dorothy King
- o Helen Arndorfer (b. 1927) married Francis Edward Kastenholz

I have much more but am not finding the HAGE family information easy to locate.

In any case WE LOVE your newsletters and I can add much more to the website regarding the Arndorfer history. Any assistance on Sunday or Monday is appreciated!
