

HISTORICALLY SPEAKING

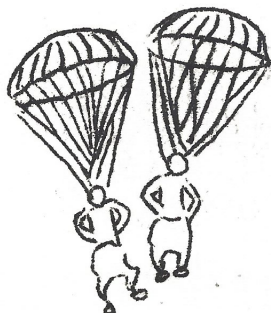
In 1938 Rev. Sam Beers came to the North Prairie and Eagle circuit and to him is due the credit of bringing Miss Stern, an Austrian Refugee from the Nazi tyranny. In the article about the choir her high qualifications have been stated.

In 1936 the Sixty fifth Anniversary celebration occurred. Many invitations to former members of the church were sent out. Rev. Petherick preserved the record of this meeting in a booklet, the worth of which is hard to estimate. The program, signatures of the guests, and letters from people who could not attend are all preserved in this booklet.

Especially are these letters valuable for through these "Ol timers" can much early church history be authenticated. This booklet sets a challenge to people who in 1961 must direct the ninetieth anniversary.

The latest high spot is to be found when Eagle separated from North Prairie and decided to walk alone; but that is a long, long story and may require more than one installment to cover it adequately.
