

John L. Bovee

Enlisted in Company A, Wisconsin 24th Infantry Regiment on 05 Aug 1862.

Promoted to Full 2nd Lieutenant on 17 Feb 1865.

Mustered out on 17 Feb 1865.

Commissioned as an officer in on 17 Feb 1865.

Transferred to Company H, Wisconsin 46th Infantry Regiment on 17 Feb 1865.

Mustered out on 27 Sep 1865 at Nashville, TN.

JOHN I. BOVEE, merchant, Brookside, a native of Waukesha Co., Wis. Came to Brookside, town of Pensaukee, Oconto County, in the year 1868; taught school one year. Engaged clerking for two years for F. B. Gardner, lumber manufacturer. Then went into employ of G. W. Delano, of Brookside, in the mercantile business; continued with him two years. Then he purchased his interest and has continued to carry on the same business until the present time (1881). In February, 1881, he took his brother Eugene in as partner, and the firm is now known as Bovee Bros. They deal quite extensively in the cedar post business. John I. Bovee enlisted Aug. 5, 1862; served until March 4, 1865. Fourteen and a half months of this time was prisoner of war (in thirty-two different prisons); promoted to second lieutenant of Co. H, 46th Wisconsin; served until 16th of October, 1865 (final discharge). Married Marion A. Morrison in 1872, daughter of Mathew Morrison, of New York State. Has held office of Town Treasurer, Assessor and Chairman of Town Supervisors.
