*Gasoline down to 99 cents a gallon Toilet paper shortage—people hoarding Early April Marion and Ralph bought a digital thermometer

4/20 Marion received Small Business Loan application for the business She owns (Thomas Press)

*4/20 Marion decorates a small fake evergreen tree for each holiday, calling it a celebration tree. Pictures, of all, plus story were submitted to "Our Wisconsin" magazine for possible publication

4/24 Marion and sister Judy in California e-mailing each other a lot More because of self-quarantining Marion pick up library books after calling in order Marion pick up audio books from library for 93-year-old friend who lives at Avalon Manor Ralph researching Saint Lukes Church for 100th year celebration 2021 for possible entries in their history publication

5/10 Could not deliver fossils brought back from Arizona for one classroom at Eagleville School due to school going virtual (it was either that, or rock samples)

5/6 USA coronavirus-19 death total at 8,000 9/6 USA coronavirus-19 death total 189,000 6.3 million cases May: Ralph sent Arizona flower pictures to church for possible use as background of virtual services Ralph e-mailed genealogy to cousins Judy and Colin in England scanning 179 items from six basement boxes
