My dear Mr. Begg:

In response to your personal inquiry of the fourteenth instant, I have the honor to advise you that from the papers in the Revolutionary War pension claim, N. 6637, it appears that Cyrus Cartwright, while residing in Windham, Windham County, Connecticut, enlisted in 1775 and was in the battles of Lexington and Bunker Hill, no officers are stated.

He enlisted May 4, 1775 or 1777 and served as a private three years in Captains Brown and Clift's Companies, Colonel Durkee's Connecticut Regiment, and was in the battles of Germantown, Fort Mifflin and Monmouth.

He was allowed pension on his application executed April 23, 1818, while a resident of Fort Ann, Washington County, New York, aged fifty nine years. He died Jan-
