ED GESLER as Brindsley Miller




KATHY SMITH as Carol Melkett

Richard of Bordeaux, born in France, was the son of the Black Prince, admired by the English for his dashing courage, his spectacular career as a soldier. The Black Prince was killed in France in one of the campaigns which formed what is now called The Hundred Years War, without gaining the throne of England. His son, who became Richard II when he was 10 years old, possessed none of his father's love of war. His attempts to gain peace for Eigland won for him the opposition of most of his ministers and forms the basis for this drama.
