Dear Bob & all - Nov. 9 - 68 -

Seems that I only write for the birthday dates that have been in my memory since I was real young. Got a letter Nov. from your mother and today from Florence sending me some pictures of the house & her & Ken - but didn't mention Norway or cousin Lars widow Nathalie Thomassen any more than the Aug 11 card from Kragerø. But I forget if I've told them that I now have more than Nathie's address. A Belleville friend Mrs. Smith got her address in June & also did not find Nathie home - but the depot man sent her & a lady with her to a store owned by 2 sisters, in Kragerø whose brother widow Mrs. Anna Nielsen & her son Thomas & little daughter Anne were visiting them & they took Mrs. Smith to graves of 2 sisters I heard from all these years since War II. I helped her get her own relatives address near Kragerø from these cousins of mine & yours, so 2 Minneapolis cousins of Mrs. Smith visited in

Norway not long before one died.
Mrs. Smith is 76 & bent over but
she is so glad she went. These
Nilsens who showed her the graves
are my cousins & yours, so I
want you all to have their address
as I never know when my rela-
tives go on a trip in future years.
This Thomas Nilsen is a merchant
navy officer mostly away at sea
but just recent months worked
in a shipping office. His mother
can't write in English but he typed
a lovely English letter. He & she
had urged Mrs. Smith to bring
me their loving greetings, so as
soon as she gave me their address
I wrote my thanks & asked if
they were in-laws of my cousin
Mrs. Jakob Nilsen or were her
cousins and mine. He said his
mother's father was Thomas Thomassen
so I suppose ~~that~~ that was a nephew
of Papas father as he had brother
Thomas. He said that Peder Jensen
(Papas grand father) was his an-
cestor also - he would write again.
But he may now be back at sea.

book - write about you all to me
as I can't imagine ever seeing you all.
