The above board met at the District Superentendent's Parsonage June 11, 1960 at 1:00 P.M. to consider sketch plans for the Eagle, Wisconsin Methodist Church addition prepared by Architects Le Febre nd Viggins.

The Committee consistin of Rev. G. Nelson, Supt., n v C. Fritz an lev. L. Leis an, Laymen L. Hess, J. Both and F. H. Potter Br. Representing the Eagle Congregation was R. Ochsenrider, Pastor, Mrs. dnah Baker, Ethel Hammer, Sam Foster and Robert Juhn.

Two requirements predicated the remodeling: the n ed of a new heating system and more space. To meet this need an additi n to the rear of the church was planned, consisting of a fellowship hall in the basement with three dual purpose rooms on the first floor.

The architect estimates this remodeling to cost approximately '50,000.00. The Congregation has \$15,000.00 available and borrowing power of another 15,000.00.

As an alternate it was planned to finish the shell of this enlargement for approximately \$28,200.00. It would consist of remodeling old basement "4,000.00, new her ting system 2,000.00, Septic tank and plumbing 1,200.00, basement ad ition only \$19,000.00, new ntry 2,00.00.

The District Committee a proved the sketch plans recommending that Eagle consider first phase to consist of the entire shell and proceed with the heating system o that it will be in oper tion for the fall season. They were ins ruct d to plan their financi 1 c mpaign with the above in mind.

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Opening Prayer by Rev. Gut Nelson, Milwaukee District Superintendent

PURPOSE AND NEED

It is the feeling of the Building Committee that the proposed Educational Building has a very definite purpose, growing out of the following needs.

- 1) There is a definite need for more educational space, with some 70 plus children attending Sunday School. This Building will provide 3000 square feet of usable space, or enough to handle 125 children adequately.
- 2) There is a definite need for a new heating system. The Building Committee feels that the Church is endangered by the present heating system.
- 3) There is a definite need for a greater Dining and Fellowship area. The proposed unit would adequately handle some 150 people.

HISTORY

The idea for the proposed building was first concieved in 1945. It has been a point of interest and conversation since, although it was some 10 years before definite action was taken.

In the summer of 1956, the Official Board voted to acquire the services of Gordon Merrit, fund raising representative for the Wisconsin Conference. The three year campaign was begun in February of 1957 and completed in February of 1960.

In January of 1959 a building Committee was formed, Sam Foster nated Chairman. An Architect was hired, preliminary plans drawn and later revised by the Building Committee in the Spring of 1960.

Final Plans were drawn and completed in the Summer of 1960. Extra funds were added as a result of our recent 100 week Building Drive.

WHAT IS THE BUILDING?

The proposed building is a 30 by 60 ¹ Educational building with a basement and first flowr.

The Basement is to be a Dining and Fellowship Hall. The upper level or first floor will be an Educational unit, eventually including 3 class rooms, 2 storage closets, and children's rest room facilities. (At present, the plans call for the shell of the upper level, including windows, doors, and insulation.

The present basement is to be remodled to include the kitchen, furnace room, and rest rooms.

Most important is the fact that this initial unit would meet all three of the above mentioned needs.
