MISSION MONTH

January was mission emphasis church. Rev. month in our Fegan's sermons for the month have all been on a mission theme. A special mission program was presented on January 19 in our church with the Rev. Anton Sturey as the speaker. Bishop Alton also scheduled his report on his visit to Africa so it fitted into our church's plans. Several people from our church went to Milwaukee to hear his report.

The church was almost full for Rev. Sturey's talk on Israel and the surrounding Arabian territories.

Rev. Sturey has been in Israel twice and has taken many lovely and interesting slides of the area. He also showed the group other objects he had picked up in his travels; part of a mural chipped from an Arab tomb, mosaic from a destroyed mosque, part of an Arab newspaper, and some native jewelry, as well as some Arab headdresses which he had Lee Foster model. The passage of time prevented him from showing his slides of the area where the Dead Sea Scrolls have been found, so he volunteered to return some other time to show them.

Twelve people from our church attended Bishop Alton's report and saw the excellent slides of his visit to our missions throughout Africa.

When our missionaries were forced to come home, the native Christians went on with the task and the church has become more African with hymns sung to the beat of drums. Now Africans welcome Americans as christians who are their brothers and they need our missionaries as counselors.

The need is great to educate young Africa. The former emphasis on lifting the many from illiteracy now needs to be changed to an emphasis on higher education. Many of the leaders of Africa are coming from the church schools as there were no other schools open to them. FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK:


