Greetings and happy 4th of July! My hopes and prayers are that you are enjoying your summer and getting some well deserved rest and relaxation. Perhaps you have had a chance to get some traveling, swimming, boating or fishing in; and my hope is that you are experiencing God's grace and joy as you find time to rest from the busy world.

In last month's Pastor's letter, we talked about vacations and I shared an article from the United Methodist magazine "Interpreter" which gave an analogy about vision and a vacation. The article explained that it's just plain foolish to pack up and get into your car to go on a vacation when you have absolutely no idea where you want to go and had not done any planning for it. That's just plain foolish because you don't know if you have enough money, if your car is in good mechanical shape, what road construction you may run into or any other number of various problems you could experience. The article also went on to explain that many people do things in life without any sense of where they are going – they have no vision; and in the same way many congregations are guilty of the same thing, they fail to develop a shared vision or sense of a preferred future. And without vision, all the planning in the world will not get them anywhere.

Recently, the Vision Committee at Eagle United Methodist church had the congregation take a Vision Survey which did two things; it gave us an idea of where the congregation is, and it showed us a shared vision of where the congregation wants to go. Now for the Body of Christ at Siloam UMC, please don't think that this talk of vision is OK for a larger church like Eagle UMC, but doesn't apply to a small congregation like you, because it does! In many ways both congregations have slowly been discovering who they are as a Body of Christ, what God's purpose is for their existence and what they should do as God's ambassadors to the world around them.

So let's take another look at vision or the shared preferred future for our church. It's important to know what we want to do, but we will never get anything done if we don't know where we are at the beginning. In the article from the Interpreter, the beginning or starting point is called a congregation's *current reality*. Current reality is everything there is to know about the congregation, the building and the community that surrounds it; and understanding current reality requires that the church council pay close attention to, among other things, how both the members and the community view the church. You see, understanding current reality is the first necessary step in developing a vision.

Now Eagle UMC has a Visioning Committee to help develop a Vision Statement that will be developed from the interviews of our community leaders and the Vision Surveys that the congregation had completed, then after a statement has been drafted, it will be presented to the congregation for fine-tuning and approval. At Siloam UMC, (Because of our small size) we will begin to form our Vision Statement through the Church Council.

So I encourage both friends and members of Eagle and Siloam UMCs to come to the Church Council meetings as we continue to discuss the current reality of our congregations and discover a shared vision for each individual congregation. Your input is needed as the congregations tweak, understand and internalize a preferred future and then finally take ownership of it. *You see a shared vision is utterly irresistible... and if we plan and act on that plan, whatever we can envision together for the glory of God, we will attain.*



JULY STEWARDSHIP MESSAGE

"In the house of the wise are stores of choice food and oil, but the foolish devour all they have." (Proverbs 21:20)

Three couples have been meeting monthly for dinner or an outing for many years. At Christmas, the couples typically exchange gifts. But last year, they decided they were giving gifts none of them really needed. One of the men suggested they make a charitable gift instead.

Now, through what they call the "Third Ticket" or the Extra Chair", each couple places the cost of an extra ticket to the show or play or the cost of an extra dinner in a jar each keeps at home. If they go out to dinner and the cost is \$20 apiece, each couple puts that amount in the jar. If they go to a play and the ticket is \$30 to \$40, each couple puts that amount in the jar. Even if they just meet on the spur of the moment for a quick lunch at \$5 apiece, they go home and put an extra \$5 in the jar.

Their motive is to save regularly in order to make a substantial charitable gift each year and to remind themselves each time they go out that there are so many people in the world who are in need.

At the end of the first year, their "Extra Chair" saving provided \$3,000, which they divided between their church's shared connectional giving (apportionments) and 3 extra mission funds — one in their local community, one in a nearby state, and a world hunger organization. They reported, "it was the best Christmas gathering the 6 of us have ever had!"

Perhaps we can use their idea to start saving for our own Christmas miracles this year!

The new computer was ordered and it has arrived!


We will be saving all the information from the old computer then set up the new one and make the transfer.
