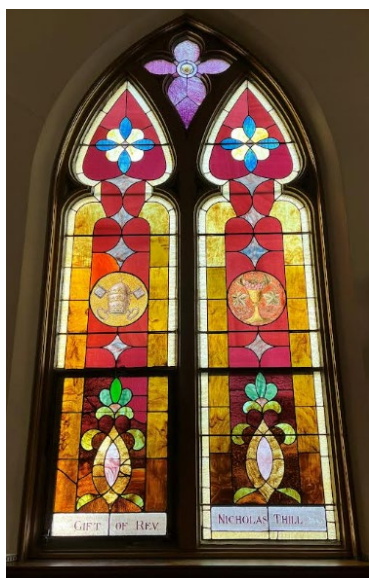
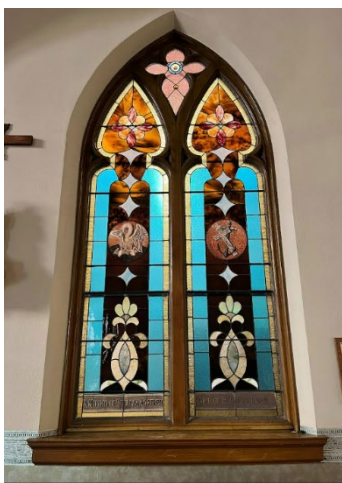


# Plans Submitted for a New Church 1895

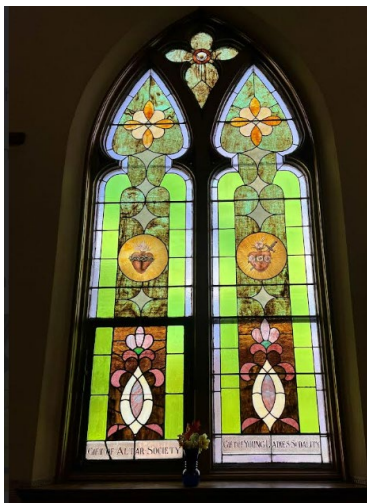
## Plans Submitted for a New Church to be built next to the rectory

"In 1896 the parish took out a loan of \$3000 at 6% interest. The people of the parish gave generously to the building of the church. The children raffled off a lamb to raise \$57.25 to pay for the large stained-glass window in the choir loft.



Fr. Thill donated a set of windows that bear his name on the right side of the church.

The Altar Society and the Young Ladies' Sodality also donated a set of windows.



The most unusual window in the church is located on the right side toward the back. It has the symbol of the Grand Army of the Republic from the Civil War. It was

purchased by Nick Demrath and August Agathen.

The other window in that set, 'the Poor Souls' window was donated by Mr. Link."
