
OBITUARY.

A. A. Duller died at Janesville Wednesday, at the age of about 75. In former years Mr. Duller was well known in Madison. He was a plasterer by trade, and came from England to America when in young manhood. He first came to Madison from Chicago, at the request of the late Contractor James Harvey, when the latter was building the west wing of the state capitol. Mr. Duller worked on the structure until his part of the work was finished. He is remembered by old settlers as the foreman of the plasterers when the federal building here was under course of construction. Then he became a contractor. He was an honest, hard working man, respected by all who had dealings with him. He lived for many years in a neat home on the south side of Clymer street, opposite Judge Donovan's home, in the Fourth ward. Mr. Duller, with his family, (a wife and seven or eight children) left Madison about 20 years ago, and settled in Stoughton. He then went to Janesville, where he lived until the time of his death. He was a member of Hope lodge, No. 17, I. O. O. F., of this city.
