Father Budde in all kindness and charity worked hand in hand with his people and they in turn did their best. He was a zealous worker in all he did.

He attended to all his duties as a true and sincere soldier in Christ's army and always was a prized symbol of the holy priesthood.

Father Budde will be missed much by all whether Catholic or non-Catholic.

Father Budde comes from a family of ten children, nine boys and one girl. Four boys became priests and are serving Christ in various churches of the Milwaukee archdiocese.

If every anyone had any problems or heartaches they

would be relieved after a visit with him.

He always greeted everyone with a smile. The doors to his rectory were always open to anyone at any time. His office and rectory were not elaborate or extremely decorated. It was a humble place, neat and very clean. It felt like home to anyone who entered it.

The parishioners will always remember Father Budde. He was understanding, helpful, kind, charitable and very considerate. He was a priest at all times.

During the course of the evening's farewell party, Father Budde was presented with a comfortable lounge chair as a token of esteem and gratitude.

We all wish Father Budde continued blessings in all his future undertakings.

sus, 124 — the results of some suburbanization and the recent increase in the size of the average American family.

The sturdy old two - room schoolhouse, parts of it perhaps 80 or 90 years of age, had become completely inadequate. The sending of the schools older children to Waukesha junior high school was increasingly expensive as both tuition and number of children mounted and might eventually endanger the districts aid from the state.

Also adjacent districts were unwilling to consider consolidation and joint building. Finally, the Genesee district had no more than \$32,000.00 at the most for a new two - room school and enough land for building since the old site was too small — not an encouraging prospect in 1954-55.

The school board reported the completed costs totalled about \$30,650. The complete building at a cost of \$22,880 includes ceramic tile floors, washrooms, and reinforced concrete construction;

Perimeter heat with diffusion through floor, 2 inch fiber glass insulation, plaster walls, with utility sinks in each class room to take care of the 54 pupils;

Asphalt tile floor, steel doors, bronze hardware, metal chalk boards, cork boards; and this cost included all fees, insurance, construction bond and architect's fees.

Of the total cost, \$4,560 went for school equipment including book shelves, teacher cabinets, wardrobe hangers, teacher desks, library table, instructional table, and cork walls in library.

Site work at a cost of \$3,210 included moving two exist-
