


*Earle's living room at Eagle*

### 'Too Skinny to Live Long', Dousman Woman Hits 97

Seven years before the Civil war began, Mary Hage, daughter of the Rev. John Hage was born in a small log cabin in Eagle. The date was April 2, 1834.

Yesterday in a modern Lannon stone house at Dousman, Mary, now Mrs. Mary Earle, celebrated her 97th birthday. Nineteen members of her family including grand and great grandchildren gathered to honor her.

In contrast to an all day ox cart trip to Milwaukee, before there was a real Milwaukee, the children sped from Milwaukee to the party in sleek modern cars in a matter of minutes.

Mrs. Earle, still in good health for her age, was the youngest child in the family. Everyone predicted that she wouldn't live long because she was so skinny, she

recalls. However, she comes from a long-lived family.

Her father was 91 when he died. Her grandfather, an Englishman, lived to be over 100 years old. Mrs. Earle lived in Eagle until 1929. At that time her husband retired from farming and they moved to Dousman. Mr. Earle died a year later.

The couple was married in 1854. Mr. Earle was a prominent Dousman. At present, Mrs. Earle lives with her daughter, the former Minnie Earle, now Mrs. Charles Cole.

Mrs. Earle had five children, three boys and two girls. Three of the children are still living. Coming from England, the Rev. Hage, bought a farm near Eagle for \$5 an acre. The land had never been tilled or had a tree cut.

Recalling her early childhood, Mrs. Earle says, we must have been tough in those days, seems like all we ever did was work and go to church.
