**DEMOCRATIC MASS MEETING AT
WAUKESHA.**

Pursuant to the call of the Democratic State Central Committee, the Democracy of Waukesha county assembled at the Court House, on Thursday, September 2d, and were called to order by Col. A. W. ENOS, on whose motion, WM. S. HAWKINS, Esq., of Waukesha, was appointed temporary chairman.

On motion, a committee to report names for permanent officers of the Convention, was appointed, consisting of Messrs. BARRON, of Waukesha; McLANE, of New Berlin; HINKLEY, of Summit; HOBBS, of Waukesha; and SPRAGUE, of Eagle.
