My parents lived at the farm on Shear Drive, and we actually lived there for a couple years after we were born. So this is the previous aerial picture that they had of the farm. My grandma is Roberta Satie. She grew up next door. Roberta is the daughter of Robert Cheer and Alice Von Ruden. So we're also Von Rudens two different ways and so I'll give you the back story with that as well. Alice Shear and her husband Robert lived in New York for a period of time. Robert was a, I worked for the motor company.

are a company I do believe.

and Roberta was born in New York and Alice got sick. My grandma always thought that it was, Alice or my grandma always thought that it was from a toothache. That's what she was told, a tooth infection and Alice got very sick. They brought Roberta back on the train and met Waldo and Irene in Janesville. So Waldo and Irene here, and Irene was a Kramer. They dropped her off and took Roberta, or took Alice to go to Kasten. That's where her family, not Kasten, Kasten, that's where her family was living at the time. Those von Rudens were previously from Eagle and had moved out to Kasten. So they had a family connection from here as well.

Robert then went back to New York and my grandma lived both with Lalo and Irene for a period of time and with his her grandparents Claire and Teresa. So they they lived on at the house next door.

Yeah, so she spent time at both places growing up and Alice passed away when she was nine months old. So she basically went up to cash into to die essentially is what grandma always said. Why grandma didn't stay with Robert, we don't know. I think that was kind of always a question that she had as well growing up. He was working and things like that. And I think they knew that they could take care of her down here. So she stayed here with them and grew up in the house next door. Claire, I have a couple things for, was also very active in the community. So he was a postmaster, he owned a grocery store or operated the grocery store for a little bit of time. And then also farmed at that farm until he moved to the house right here on Jericho. He worked for the county. He worked for the county for many, many years and until here time. Rockford County. Yeah.

Of Crossways? Yeah, from the time it was signed over by the government in 1838 or whatever. And so that's not it, he's not listed anywhere there. So the

only other place I'm thinking that it was, was across the street. Because there was a Bronson that built a store over there, and up until 1945 that store was, or that building was the post office as well. It was a store and post office where the fire station is right now. Oh, where the fire station is? Yeah, roughly right there. And anyway, it doesn't give a good history, I'd have to look further to follow that line. But I'm almost betting that that's where the store is at.

married Letty Lum, and the Lums were from Troy. They came from Prussia and lived in Troy. So I have some of the plot maps for where they lived. They had a farm in Troy, but I can't find where James. James' dad was Timothy Shear also lived in Troy. Excuse me. I'm assuming they met us because of where they lived in proximity. James' sister also married a Lum, so they married into that family two different ways. And I can't find where James and Letty lived growing up, where they married and established. From the articles that I see, it looks like they lived on the Von Ruden farm. So I'm not really sure how that all worked. So I have some articles and things like that that I'll share, and I didn't know if you guys knew to help us piece some of that stuff together. But I have a lot of pictures, like I said, of newspaper articles and obituaries and things like that that my grandma had.

My grandma gave this to me quite a few years ago, and there are some names that you guys are going to recognize in there as well, and a lot of really cool passages and singings.

And lums were married to James Shear. Yes. Yep. Claire's dad. Yep. Lettie married Claire's dad.

Yeah, so that's pretty cool. And my- This is Lettie? That's Lettie, yep. Oh my, that's about the best you've ever told me. And my grandma also had from Lettie old-fashioned hand mirror. And so my grandma was always really amazing about when she gave her stuff, she would write little inscriptions on where it's from and how she came about it and those sort of things. So I have some old, some of the cool things is just some dishes and things that my grandma had from Teresa, her grandma, and some of them were like tablecloth. So Claire and Teresa hosted card club pretty regularly. And they had a very special tablecloth that they would put out after card club and entertain after card club. You have your face close to her and you can see. Yeah, and from newspaper articles and from notes that grandma had.

So, Waldo and I re-rented that from them for a period of time until they bought it, yeah.

Well, they never bought it, they made monthly payments. Okay. I think that they told, well, they was paid for before it passed. Not too long before, he had it paid for.

So, some of my articles that I found from Waukesha Freeman from 1917 said Postmaster Claire Scheer purchased the Knight Place on Jericho Street. So I don't know if that, the Knight K-N-I-G-H-T, so I don't know if the Knights owned it first.

1906 that Mr. and Mrs. Clear Shear moved on the Von Ruden farm and Mr. and Mrs. James Shear have moved back on the old homestead. I don't know what the old homestead is.

Isn't that back on the farm? What year was that?

Jamie Socolick 16:35

This was 1906.

I don't think James Shearer had anything to do with that farm.

Jamie Socolick 16:40

So, nope, he didn't...

Yes. Correct. West, someplace. Troy, or...

And then part of that says Clear Shear will move to the Von Ruden farm known as the Julius Baker farm.

This is from, I mean, this is cool cause you can, it's like original paper where you can see through it. That's really old. This is really old. 1981 grandma wrote this in, she had her own room and was approximately six years of age when she was taken by her grandparents to the home in Eagle for her to attend graded school. But do you know why that was done? For the property, I'm assuming.

It was done for inheritance taxes. She had to prove that she lived at the farm to get inheritance taxes reduced. Oh, OK. That's what that's from, Jane. Sure. She bought that for a long time for inheritance taxes when we sold that.

He's a Kramer, who her sister married a rock teacher. Evelyn. Her sister? Okay. Her sister was Evelyn, who married Drone, Drone, Drone. It just seems strange now that...

also donated \$250 to St. Teresa's Church. Yeah, yeah, that was great. Yeah, so, I reigned it, I reigned it, yeah.

when she and part of her will is to give some distinct reasons. So interestingly, so grandma has the article, a copy of the article from their estate, and here is like from Miele funeral home, her sort of assets. And one of the things was the estate was valued at \$182,000.

This was in... 1982? 1979.

That was valued at \$150,000, the land contract \$11,000, and the bank account had about \$12,000 in savings and stocks and bonds.

I also have the original certificate of baptism for Irene which is kind of cool from St. Teresa's.

Yeah, well that I I love this stuff. So, um, there was an appraisal of the sheer farm. Um, and it had Waldo and Claire on it, and it was a survey of 110 acres located in section 34 of the town of Eagle. Um, it had about 85 acres under cultivation and the balance consisting of the 25 acres as well wooded. So this is pretty cool. It has the assessed value of \$23,000 and what a year. This was in 1961.
