According to Brandt, the program is designed for individuals and groups who plan to attend an activity or organized event where alcohol is served. The basic

"Waukesha Cares" package includes lodging, meals and transportation; however, personalized packages are available.

The Waukesha Area Tourism Council assists individuals and groups in purchasing "Waukesha Cares" packages from participating area businesses.
